8-week commitment

This is a parent therapeutic group that will provide a safe space to work through an FBT informed parent focused treatment model. This group is intended to support parent(s) of a teen with a restrictive eating disorder. This group will spend 1-2 sessions on psychoeducation of restrictive eating disorders and Phase I FBT tenants in breaking down treatment. The next 2-3 sessions will work through parental empowerment, problem solving around meal support/structure, setting limits, and working through renourishment through an FBT lens. The last 4 sessions will discuss and highlight supporting the supports, readiness for FBT stage 2 work and addressing parental anxiety, burnout, and compassion fatigue.
